- ➤ USAID ensures gender-responsive value chain analyses, seeks opportunities for private sector partnerships to strengthen market opportunities for local women cooperatives and entrepreneurs and assure GBV risk assessments are integrated into all program aspects



Coffee sector A Priority of U.S. Investment

- ➤ U.S. Government has been a constant source of support to the Burundi coffee sector since the reform efforts started in 2008.
- Examples of initiatives: "Cup of Excellence" and the professional coffee organization "Intercafe.
- A PPP/GDA with two private companies with impressive results



Coffee sector A Priority of U.S. Investment

> Coffee provides income to over 600,000 farming households and accounts for more than 50% of Burundi's foreign exchange earnings



Let's Talk Priorities

- ➤ Burundi has benefited \$ 23 Million from USDA Food for Progress to support the coffee sector in Burundi small farmers
- ➤ USAID and TMEA envisages to support Burundi in redefining its trade strategy by strengthening new export potential value chains, enhancing cross border trade with DRC and increasing its penetration in the regional market
- The three value chains finalized for export interventions under growth hub program were Tropical Fruits, Palm Oil and Fisheries

Priorities and Strategic Objectives

> The Imbo Region contributes to:

- > 30 % of Burundi's staple crop production,
- > 70 % of fish stock and distribution,
- > 30 % of livestock and
- > 45 % of national milk production

USAID/Burundi wishes to include in its priorities the diversification of agricultural value chains, strengthening smallholder productivity focusing on the potato -beans -banana- maize- dairy- poultry systems.
